Tribute to a Good Friend: Jorge Perez-Rico

Jorge Perez-Rico, for 20 years an active participant in Project Gettysburg-León and a tireless advocate for the Latino and migrant community in Adams County, died suddenly in July of this year and the people of PGL, together with his wife Victoria, and his children, Elena, Vicki, Elias and José, continue to mourn his death. Jorge's favorite phrase was "echala ganas" which means "work with a will," and if any man did work with a will it was Jorge. It is challenging to list all the programs that Jorge organized and energized during his 25 years in Gettysburg. He was a founder of Casa de la Cultura, facilitated the successful applications of more than 200 Deferred Action Childhood Arrival young people, arranged swimming clinics and computer labs for migrant children, organized varied ESL opportunities, began the first Spanish newspaper and Spanish radio programming in Adams County, led the "green politics" of the Painted Turtle Farm, headed a 27 team soccer league for farmworkers, arranged for Latino residents to interpret their own reality through photography, all in addition to his work as a family educator at Lincoln Intermediate Unit #12. Jorge believed, as Martin Luther King repeatedly said, that the arc of the moral universe is long but it bends toward justice. In his daily life and work, Jorge depended upon that promise, and for his faithfulness to that vision he received the Martin Luther King Celebration "Living the Dream" award in 2012.

59. Collectible Nicaraguan Pottery from San Juan De Oriente

Auction Committee

Beautiful, large pottery piece with pre-Columbian designs with Jaguar features. San Juan De Oriente is still primarily inhabited by the indigenous descendants of the original Nahuatl (pronounced nah-whal) Indian tribes. Legends tell of a female spirit who lived in the Masaya volcano and was consulted for prophecies and resolving conflicts among the tribes. Depending on the circumstances, she was offered food that was delivered on elaborate clay platters that were made in San Juan. At the time of the Spanish presence on the continent, in fact, the village became so well known for its clay pieces that the Spaniards called it San Juan de los Platos (the dishes). Centuries-old tax records show the village even paying their tribute to the Spanish King with pottery. It was not until Nicaragua declared its independence from Spain in 1821 that the name was officially changed to San Juan de Oriente. Some of the pottery of San Juan is still made using the coil method, but most is done on a kick-wheel. The pieces are dried and decorated, then low-fired in beehive-style adobe kilns using wood fires for fuel. Many of the pots are in the style of design they call "inciso," or incised, a traditional technique dating back more than 2500 years, and many are still decorated with traditional pre-Columbian designs. It is only recently that some of the potters have begun to supplement the traditional pre-Columbian motifs for more modern forms of expression. It is an exhaustive process, but one that yields some of the world's most magnificent and collectible pottery.
